## Sunday Teaching

In the mornings, we are going to look at Luke's account of the days after Jesus' ascension. We see the remarkable power of the gospel as it sweeps across Jerusalem, Judea and Samaria, to the very ends of the earth. We also glimpse the very foundation stones of the church of Jesus Christ, as they are set in place.

In the evenings we will build on our studies of Exodus & Joshua, and look at how the nation of Israel established itself in the Promised Land under the rule of the Judges. We will see that God's people made the same mistakes repeatedly, but He never gave up on them and remained faithful to all His promises.

## Our church over the years

The roots of our church have been traced back to the start of the nineteenth century with cottage services in the local hamlet of Pye Corner and meetings in the nearby village of Winterbourne.

These local worshippers were able to hold services in a building dedicated to that purpose with the opening of the current building in 1816.

A British Day School was started by the church in 1849, teaching some 30 to 40 local children. The day school pupils transferred, along with their two teachers, across to the other side of the Common in 1911 to occupy a newly-built Council School.

A Congregational church for many years, in 1970 the church name was changed to Whiteshill Evangelical Church.

In 1979 the church became affiliated to the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches (FIEC) which encourages fellowship between, and provides advice and support to, around 500 'Bible-based' churches across the country.

Whiteshill has no seat to seat collection. There are freewill offering boxes at the back of the church. An induction loop is installed - please turn hearing aids to T.

The services are recorded each week, and these can be borrowed in various formats.

The **Sunday Morning Service** begins at 11.00 for about 1 hour. Tea & coffee are served afterwards.

During the morning service younger children join "Jesus and Me" (JAM) for their own programme. There is also a separate group for older children called EPIC (Everything Purposed In Christ).

There is a crèche for very young children.

The **Sunday Evening Service** begins at 6.00 for about 1 hour. Tea & coffee are served afterwards.

We share communion on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday (am) and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday (pm) of the month.

Our desire is to meet with the Lord as we worship Him, and to work together to understand His Word.

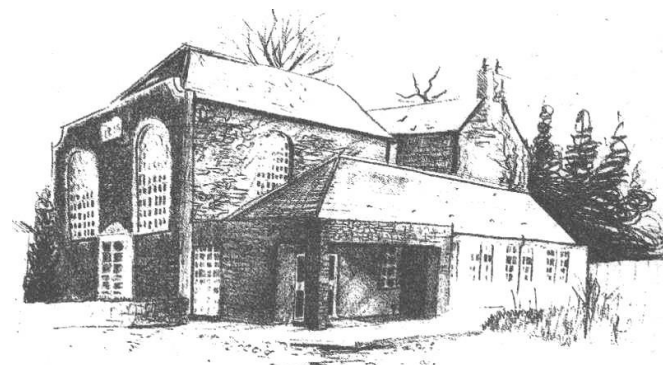
